Cancer Burden in Kenya

- In **Kenya**, the population is roughly **52.8million**
- The new cases being reported with cancer is about **47,887** annually with **32,987 Deaths.**
- Childhood 3,272 new cases annually. Leading cases Leukemia, NHL
