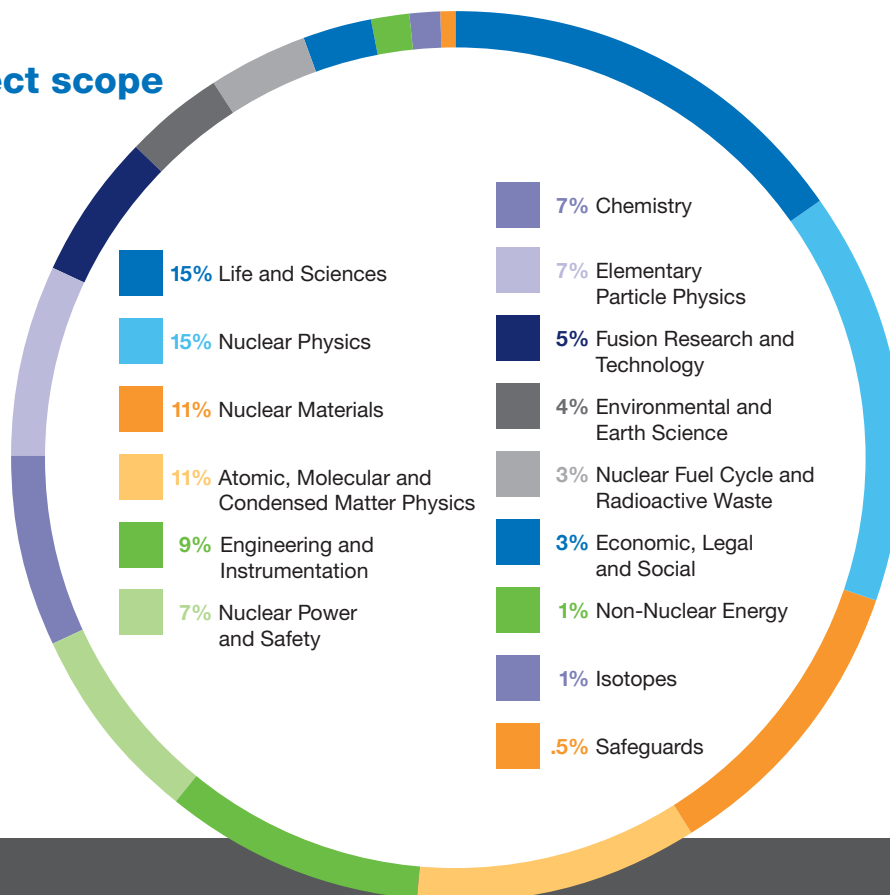
INIS was established in 1970 to 'foster the exchange of scientific and technical information on peaceful uses of atomic energy'. With over four million records

About us

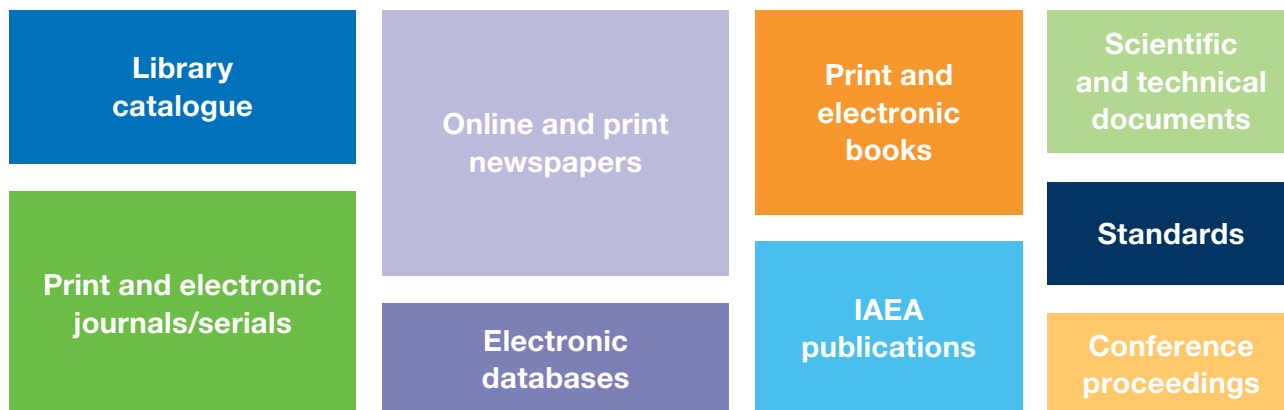
