- We are considering to introduce nuclear power for the first time. What do we need to know about civil liability for nuclear damage?
- Given the small size of small modular reactors (SMRs) and presumably smaller risks, do we need to address nuclear liability?
- We don't have an NPP but our neighbour is constructing one. How can we assure ourselves of compensation?
- As a coastal State, how are we protected in the event of a nuclear accident during maritime transport of radioactive material through our waters?

As more countries turn to nuclear energy—including traditional Nuclear Power Plants (NPPs) and Small Modular Reactors (SMRs)—the legal frameworks addressing civil liability and compensation in the event of a nuclear accident become increasingly vital.

Though a specialized area of nuclear law not always familiar to many policymakers and decision makers, the legal frameworks are of paramount importance to enabling the full potential of nuclear power to meet the rising energy demand for a low-carbon energy source, address energy security concerns and contribute to net zero emissions.

This workshop is designed for diplomatic and non-diplomatic staff of IAEA Member States who want to understand more about the Global Nuclear Liability Regime as called for annually by the General Conference and its relevance for NPP operating countries, newcomer countries and neighboring countries, as well as coastal states. Participants will gain insights into how nuclear liability frameworks support cross-border cooperation, investment confidence, and public protection.
