## VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE GENERAL FUND FOR 1962

## Proposals by Brazil and South Africa

1. Experience over the past few years has shown the extent to which an expansion of the activities of the Agency, more particularly in the field of technical assistance, is dependent on the volume of contributions received to the Agency's General Fund. From time to time appeals have been made in individual speeches to the General Conference for larger contributions to this Fund, but the problems involved have not hitherto been the subject of a formal draft resolution.

2. The possibility of placing a draft resolution before the Board of Governors at its meetings in June 1961, with a view to its adoption in the form of a recommendation to the General Conference, was seriously considered. Nevertheless it was felt that since this was an issue which concerned the totality of the Agency's membership, it would be more fitting to invite the General Conference itself to initiate action in this respect rather than have the matter discussed by the Board in the first instance.

3. To this end, the following draft resolution, the text of which is self-explanatory, is submitted to the General Conference for consideration:

INCREASED VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE GENERAL FUND

The General Conference,

(a) <u>Considering</u> that some of the most important activities of the Agency are financed by voluntary contributions from its Member States,

(b) Aware that these activities constitute the bulk of the Agency's direct assistance to those of its Member States that are less advanced in nuclear technology,

(c) <u>Seriously concerned</u> by the fact that in no year to date have voluntary contributions amounted to more than two-thirds of the target figure established by the General Conference, and

(d) <u>Noting with appreciation</u> the action of the General Assembly of the United Nations in unanimously inviting the economically developed Members of the United Nations and the Agency to increase their voluntary contributions to the General Fund, [1]

1. Fully endorses the appeal made by the General Assembly of the United Nations in paragraph 2 of resolution 1531(XV);

General Assembly resolution 1531(XV), paragraph 2, reproduced in document GC(V)/154, Annex III.

2. <u>Invites such Members to make voluntary contributions to the General Fund for</u> 1962 and succeeding years in amounts that are at least the same percentages of the target for each year as are their assessed contributions to the Regular Budget; and

3. <u>Invites</u> other Members which for any reason are unable to contribute to the General Fund on the scale indicated in paragraph 2 of this resolution to demonstrate their continued support of the Agency by making each year at least a token contribution to that Fund.

4. Attached as an information annex to this memorandum is a table showing the contributions made to the General Fund for the years 1958-61, together with particulars of the percentage contributions of Member States to the Regular Budget for 1961.
