CREDENTIALS OF DELEGATES TO THE SEVENTEENTH REGULAR SESSION

(b) REPORT OF THE CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE Chairman: Dr. Tulio A. MARULANDA (Colombia)

1. The Credentials Committee<sup>1</sup>/ met on 20 September 1973 to examine the credentials of delegates to the session, as provided for in Article 28 of the Conference's Rules of Procedure. Dr. Tulio A. Marulanda of Colombia was unanimously elected Chairman, and the present report was prepared at the conclusion of the Committee's deliberations.

2. In the course of the Committee's examination of the credentials, the delegate of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics stated that his Government could not acknowledge "the legality of the Saigon administration" to represent South Viet-Nam". He further stated that "the Secul administration, which rejects proposals to unite Korea on a peaceful basis, does not represent the interests of the population of South Korea. For this reason, the Soviet Delegation could not accept as valid the credentials presented by the Secul administration".

3. The delegate of Poland stated that his Government "could not accept as valid the credentials of the Saigon and the Seoul administrations, as the Saigon administration does not represent the Vietnamese people and the Seoul administration does not represent the Korean people."

4. The Committee found that credentials satisfying the provisions of Rule 27 of the Rules of Procedure had been submitted to the Director General for the delegates of the following 71 Member States:

5. The Committee found that the credentials submitted for the delegates of the following six Members did not satisfy the provisions of Rule 27:

Colombia	Uruguay

The consensus was, however, that in accordance with the practice of the Agency, of the United Nations and of other international organizations, the credentials in question should be accepted as provisional, on the understanding that satisfactory credentials for the delegates concerned would be submitted as soon as possible.

6. At the time the Committee met no credentials had been received by the Director General in respect of the delegates representing the following seven Members:

The Committee was nevertheless of the opinion that these delegates should be provisionally seated with the same rights as other delegates, pending submission of their credentials.
