THE VIENNA CONVENTION ON CIVIL LIABILITY FOR NUCLEAR DAMAGE

The General Conference,

(a) <u>Recalling</u> the adoption in May 1963, under the auspices of the International Atomic Energy Agency, of the Vienna Convention on Civil Liability for Nuclear Damage,

(b) Noting that the Convention has been in force since November 1977 for a number of developing countries in Latin America, Europe, Africa and Asia,

(c) Noting with appreciation that, with the assistance of the Agency, several Member States not yet parties to the Covention have adopted or are preparing legislation based on the principles and provisions of the Convention,

(d) <u>Considering</u> that the Convention provides a worldwide framework for dealing with third-party liability issues which might arise from certain peaceful uses of nuclear energy,

(e) <u>Considering</u> that further acceptances of the Convention will contribute to the development of the peaceful uses of nuclear energy throughout the world, and

(f) Noting that a number of Member States are parties to the Convention on Third Party Liability in the Field of Nuclear Energy (Paris Convention of 29 July 1960) and the Convention Supplementary to the Paris Convention of 29 July 1960 (Brussels Supplementary Convention of 31 January 1963),

1. <u>Requests</u> the Director General to continue the Agency's interest in the field of liability for nuclear damage;

2. <u>Expresses</u> the hope that more Member States will give consideration to adhering to the Convention; and

3. <u>Further requests</u> the Director General to report to the General Conference at its next regular session on further acceptances of the Convention.
