Explanatory Note by the Islamic Republic of Iran on Promotion of Efficiency and Effectiveness of IAEA Decision Making Process

"Promotion of Efficiency and Effectiveness of IAEA Decision Making Process" is an urgent need to make IAEA correspond to current global realities. Therefore, a comprehensive discussion on IAEA current decision making process and to explore ways and means on promotion of its efficiency and effectiveness particularly in light of the following points are required:

- Recalling Article IV (C) of the Statute on the principles of Sovereign States of all members of the Agency, in order to ensure to all of them the rights and benefits resulting from membership,
- Bearing in mind the fundamental structural changes that have been taken place in the recent decades in international relations, particularly in the global nuclear community engaged in the peaceful uses of nuclear energy,
- Bearing also in mind the limited and inequitable geographical representation of Members on the IAEA Board of Governors and recalling paragraph (c) of the *Resolution* GC(41)/RES/20 adopted by the General Conference on 3 October 1997 which noted the interest of Member States of all regions in considering Board membership in the light of geopolitical and technical realities which was endorsed later by the General Conference Resolution entitled GC(43)/RES/19 of October 1999 on amendment to Article VI,
- Recognizing the obstacles before entry into force of Resolution GC(43)/RES/19 of
 October 1999 while the vast majority of Members hold the view to expand the size and
 composition of the Board,
- Taking note of the necessity of direct engagement and participation of all Member States in the decision making process regarding all fundamental issues related to the work of Agency or having impact on sovereign rights of Member States by the Board of Governors resolutions specifically those not adopted with consensus,

- Recognizing the need for restructuring the Board of Governors including the mandate and composition in light of developments in last decade, recognizing that the Agency's longer term and strategic decisions, particularly those that could affect sovereign rights, national security, membership status or the interests of Member States in the application of atomic energy for peaceful uses in accordance with the Statute, shall only be taken by all Member States within the General Conference,
- Recalling the decision of the previous General Conferences to insert the issue of "Promotion of Efficiency and Effectiveness of IAEA Decision Making Process" into its Agenda which was followed by a the fruitful discussion on the issue in the Committee of the Whole where several delegations expressed their desire to continue consultations on the issue,
- Noting the importance of maintaining and promoting the efficiency and effectiveness of the Agency's decision-making processes and strengthening the Agency and its governing bodies,
- Emphasizing by several Members the importance of the direct engagement and participation of all Member States in the decision-making process on issues related to the Agency's work,
- Mindful of the need to promote the efficiency of the working methods and application
 of procedures of the IAEA bodies to take advantage of the advanced technologies
 including by Improving the Method of Voting in the IAEA General Conference and taking
 note of the request made to the Secretariat to continue to examine the matter,
- Emphasizing the necessity for the continuation of common efforts by all Member States, together with the Secretariat, to strengthen the Agency, promote transparency and achieve mutual interests,
- Noting the desire of some Member States to continue consideration of the issue and to keep it as an item on the General Conference agenda.

In this vein, the inclusion of an item entitled "Promotion of Efficiency and Effectiveness of IAEA Decision Making Process" in the agenda of the 61st regular session of the General Conference would facilitate the continuation of a comprehensive discussion on the issue.
