# ACTION TAKEN BY STATES IN CONNECTION WITH THE STATUTE

## Information received by the Secretariat up to 30 April 1971

Modifications arising out of further information received by 31 December 1971

- 1. In Part I, Table 1:
  - (a) Replace the entry beginning: "CONGO, Democratic Republic of ...."

by: [Congo, Democratic Republic of] 1h) [Congo (Leopoldville)] 1h).

(b) After the entry "[Egypt]1g)", insert:

EGYPT, Arab Republic of  $^{1}g$ ) x x 26 Oct 1956 R 4 Sep 1957 40.

(c) Replace the entry beginning: "UNITED ARAB REPUBLIC1g) ...."

by: [United Arab Republic] 1g),

(d) Insert the following as the penultimate entry:

ZAIRE, Republic of 1h)

A 10 Oct 1961 77.

- 2. In Part I, SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION, paragraph 1:
  - (a) Amend sub-paragraph (a) to read:

For the use of the designations "Congo, Democratic Republic of" and "Congo (Leopoldville)", see sub-paragraph (h) below.

(b) Amend the opening words of sub-paragraph (g) to read:

Use of the designations "Syrian Arab Republic", "United Arab Republic" and "Egypt, Arab Republic of"

and insert the following new sub-paragraph at the end:

(iii) In a communication received from the Permanent Mission of the Arab Republic of Egypt to the Agency on 7 September 1971, the Secretariat was informed that:

- "... after the referendum on the Federation of the Arab Republics on the 1st of September 1971, the official name of the United Arab Republic, starting from the 2nd of September 1971 is as follows: The Arab Republic of Egypt...."
- (c) Insert the following new sub-paragraph (h):
  - (h) Use of the designations "Zaire, Republic of", "Congo, Democratic Republic of" and "Congo (Leopoldville)":
    - (i) The Statute was accepted on 10 October 1961 on behalf of Congo (Leopoldville).
    - (ii) In a communication received from the Governor from the Democratic Republic of the Congo on the Board of Governors on 26 February 1965, the Secretariat was informed that:
      - ".... as the result of a constitutional referendum held in July 1964, the Congolese people approved the new constitution according to which the official designation of my country is The Democratic Republic of the Congo.
      - "I should be grateful if, in the alphabetical lists of countries that appear in the Agency's publications and other documents, the name of my country could be included under Congo, Democratic Republic of." (Original French: translation by the Secretariat)
    - (iii) In a communication received from the Embassy of the Republic of Zaire in Austria on 4 November 1971, the Secretariat was informed that:
      - "....The Democratic Republic of the Congo will henceforth be designated the Republic of Zaire."

- 3. Replace Part III by the following new text:

#### PART III

ACCEPTANCES OF THE AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE VI.A.1-VI.A.3
OF THE STATUTE

(approved by the General Conference by Resolution GC(XIV)/RES/272)

On 31 December 1971, when there were 102 States Members of the Agency, 21 had accepted the amendment to Article VI.A.1-A.3 of the Statute which the General Conference had approved on 28 September 1970, as shown in Table 4 below.

### SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION

- 1. Effect of deposits of instruments of acceptance. The amendment will come into force when it has been accepted by two thirds of all the Members of the Agency in accordance with their respective constitutional processes, as provided for by Article XVIII. C. (ii) of the Statute.
- 2. Application of the amendment to Berlin (West). In a note dated 3 September 1971 the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany referred to the instrument of acceptance that had been deposited by its Government on 1 September 1971, and declared:
- ".... that the said amendment shall apply to Berlin in the same manner as the Statute itself."

- 3. Application of the amendment to the Netherlands Antilles and Surinam. The instrument of acceptance by the Netherlands states that the Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands accepts the amendment "for the Kingdom in Europe, for Surinam and for the Netherlands Antilles".
